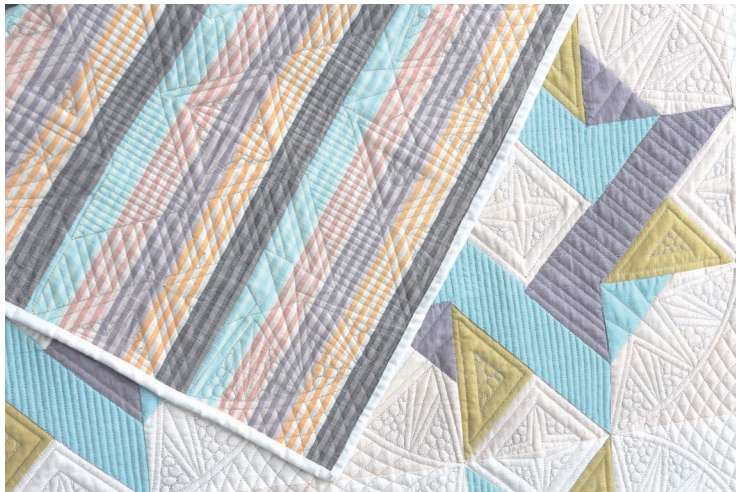

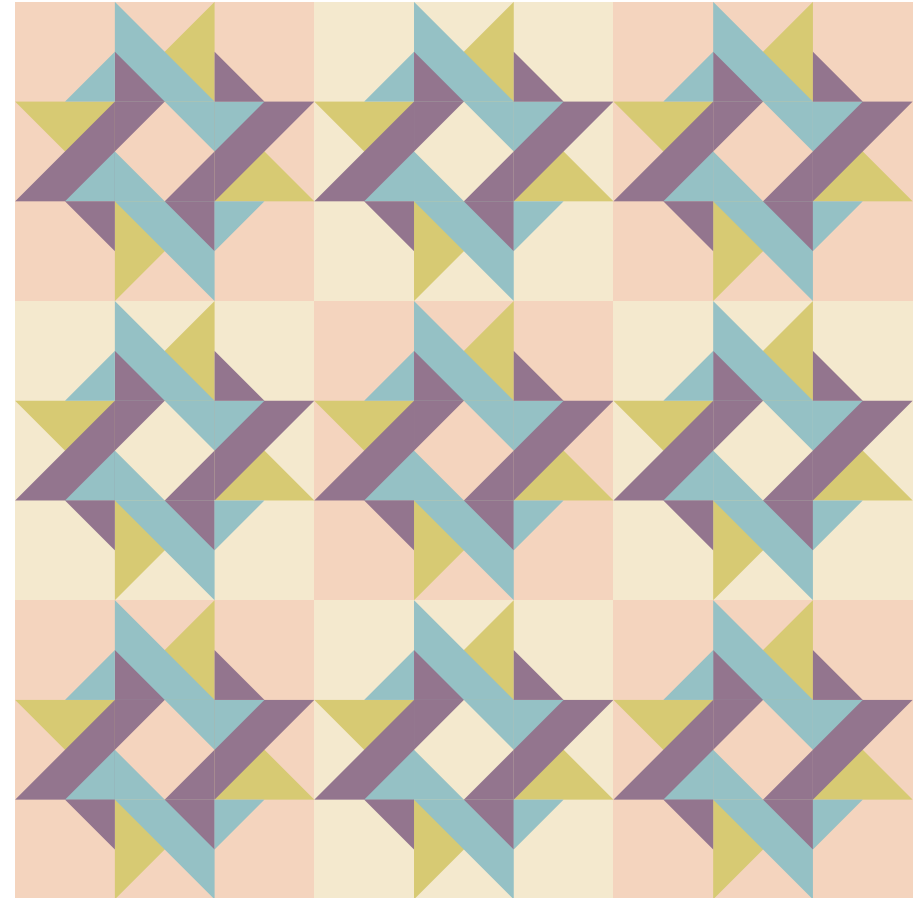

## Fabric Requirements

Fabric Required	SKU	Description
1 ½ yds	9062	Fabric A: Peach Rose
2 yds	9053	Fabric B: Froth (binding)
1 ¼ yds	9054	Fabric C: Breezeway
1 yd	9086	Fabric D: Applewine
1 ¼ yds	9040	Fabric E: Lilac
3 ½ yds	CS8994	Cabana Stripes Tart Orange (backing)

## Finishing

6. Following the Quilt Diagram (front cover) or photo, sew the blocks into (3) Rows of (3) Blocks, alternating the Fabric B and A as pictured. Press toward the Fabric B blocks to nest seams.
7. Sew the binding strips together end to end with diagonal seams. Press seams open and then press binding in half lengthwise with wrong sides together. Layer the backing, batting and quilt top and quilt as desired. Attach the binding to finish the quilt.



## Instructions

Please read **all instructions** carefully before beginning. Using a scant  $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowance is suggested.

### Cutting

**From Fabric A, 9062 Peach Rose, cut:**

(5)  $6\frac{1}{2}$ " wof strips, sub-cut to (25)  $6\frac{1}{2}$ " squares

(1)  $7\frac{1}{4}$ " wof strips, subcut to (5)  $7\frac{1}{4}$ " squares, then cut on both diagonals into (20) triangles

**From Fabric B, 9053 Froth, cut:**

(4)  $6\frac{1}{2}$ " wof strips, sub-cut to (20)  $6\frac{1}{2}$ " squares

(1)  $7\frac{1}{4}$ " wof strips, subcut to (4)  $7\frac{1}{4}$ " squares, then cut on both diagonals into (20) triangles

(7)  $2\frac{1}{2}$ " wof strips for binding

**From Fabric C, 9054 Breezeway, cut:**

(5)  $3\frac{1}{2}$ " wof strips, sub-cut to (54)  $3\frac{1}{2}$ " squares

(2)  $6\frac{7}{8}$ " wof strips, sub-cut to (9)  $6\frac{7}{8}$ " squares, then cut on one diagonal into (18) triangles

**From Fabric D, 9086 Apple Wine, cut:**

(2)  $7\frac{1}{4}$ " wof strips, sub-cut to (9)  $7\frac{1}{4}$ " squares, then cut on both diagonals into (36) triangles

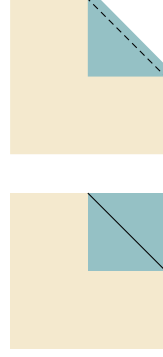
**From Fabric E, 9040 Lilac, cut:**

(5)  $3\frac{1}{2}$ " wof strips, sub-cut to (54)  $3\frac{1}{2}$ " squares

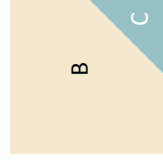
(2)  $6\frac{7}{8}$ " wof strips, sub-cut to (9)  $6\frac{7}{8}$ " squares, then cut on one diagonal into (18) triangles

### Piecing

1. Draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of all  $3\frac{1}{2}$ " squares with a pencil or erasable marking tool. Place a Fabric C  $3\frac{1}{2}$ " square along the corner of one Fabric A  $6\frac{1}{2}$ " square and stitch along the marked line. Trim  $\frac{1}{4}$ " away from the stitching line to remove excess corner fabric (**Figure 1**). Press open toward the corner. Repeat to make the number of units shown (**Figure 2**).



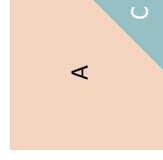

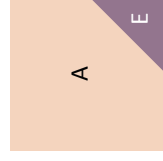

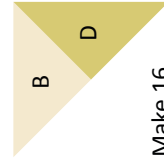

2. Sew Fabric D triangles to Fabric A and Fabric B triangles to make 16 of each combination (**Figure 3**). Press seams open. Sew one Fabric C triangle to the long side of a Fabric B/D unit to make a square. Press toward the large triangles and trim dog ears. Repeat to make the number of squares shown (**Figure 4**).

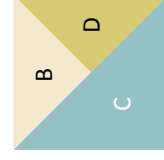

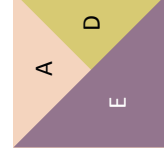

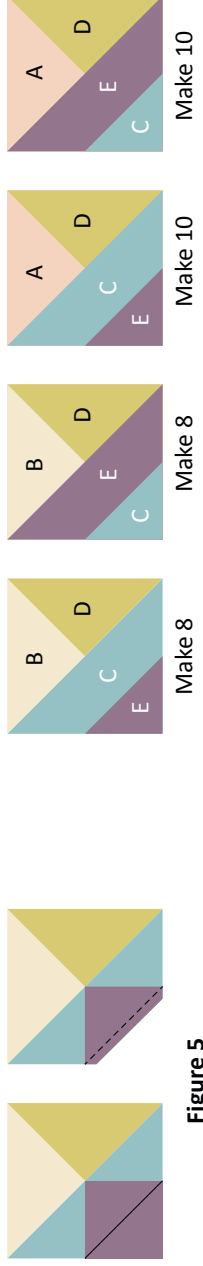

- Place a Fabric E marked  $3\frac{1}{2}$ " square onto the corner one of the units from Step 2, overlapping the large Fabric C triangle, sew on the mark line, trim away the excess and press open (**Figure 5**). Repeat to make the number of units shown (**Figure 6**).

- Place (2) Fabric E marked  $3\frac{1}{2}$ " squares on opposite corners of a Fabric B  $6\frac{1}{2}$ " square. Sew on the marked line, trim and press as before. Repeat with (2) Fabric C marked  $3\frac{1}{2}$ " squares on the remaining two corners. Sew on the line, trim and press. Repeat to make 4 units (Figure 7). Repeat with (5) Fabric A  $6\frac{1}{2}$ " squares and the remaining  $3\frac{1}{2}$ " squares (**Figure 8**).



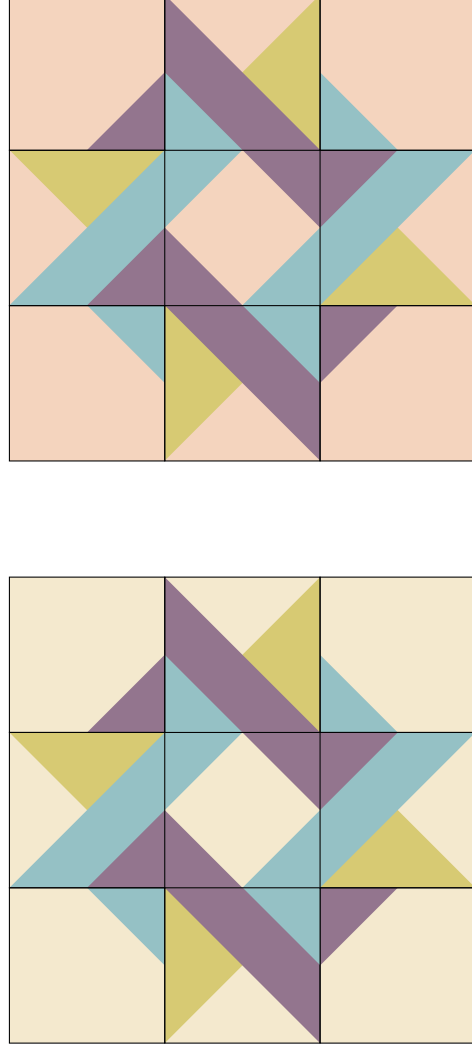

- See **Figure 9** for block construction. Paying attention to the order and orientation of each unit, sew the units into 3 rows of 3 units each to make the (9) blocks pictured. Press as desired to nest seam allowances or press open.
